Mad Props

There is a predominant reason I have kept this job for the last two and a half years: free admission to all the clubs and concerts. The drawback is that occasionally I have to write about events before they happen, which isn't much fun — but compared to dropping 10 bucks at the door of a nightclub, it's a small price. This week in "Clubbed to Death," it's bill-paying time.

First up: **MixMaster Mike** of the **Invisibl Skratch Piklz**. Invisibl Skratch Piklz is a West Coast crew of DJ wizards who do all kinds of tricks with the turntables. All the hip magazines give them mad props. They scratch and cut up beats and scratch and levitate pieces of silverware and make small animals appear out of nowhere.

They also cut women in half with knives. **MixMaster Mike** will be performing his turntable sorcery at **Mystique** in Restaurant Row, Wednesday, Jan. 21. Doors open at 9 p.m. The price: \$6 before 11 p.m., \$8 after for ages 21 and over; a flat 10 bucks for ages 18-21. Rounding out the bill is **Peace Harvest** of the impressive **Ninja Tune** and **Kut Master Spaz** of the less impressive **I-94**. Information: 533-0061.

On Thursday, Jan. 22, I suggest you keep it moving at **3d Eye Thursdays** at **1739 Kalakaua** — a hip hop extravaganza that's been going off weekly since Jan. 1. Unlike the typical evening at 1739, Thursdays' feature hip hop in both rooms — I give them mad props for that. This week's featured DJs are **Jrama**, **G-dog**, **Swurv**, **Bumble Bee** and **Gary-O**, among others.

The ravers in the house will have to wait until Saturday, Jan. 24 for "**The DJ Who Loved Me**," presented by **G-Spot** and **Miss Moneypenny**. Featured turntablists are Seattle's **Jon Lemmon** (**Secret Agent of the Funky Beats**), San Francisco DJs **Mess** (as **Dr. No Dady Records**) and **Rob Drake** (as **Jaws**), Hawai'i-via-Chicago DJ **G-Spot** (as **Double 0 Spot**) **Tricky Trevor** (as **Gold Finger**), **Mario** (as **Mr. Big**) and **Ikon** (as **Odd Job**). Jungle warfare specialists **4rest**, **Euphorite** and **Mike F** appear, too, with a special 2x4 assault by **Spex** and

Mase (a four-turntable duo). Clearly this rave is not for the faint-hearted. "**The DJ Who Loved Me**" plays at **Climbers Paradise**, 214 Sand Island Access Rd. The cover is 10 dollars U.S. currency before 11 p.m.; maybe more after that.

Of course, not everyone is a citizen of the rave or hip-hop nation; Clubland is also the home of our weird cousins, the citizens of the Goth nation. Every Wednesday, Goth kids can gather and be wicked or whatever at **The Mixx** with **Cyn City's 7 Deadly Sins**. Ill-informed Goth children have already missed the celebrations of the first two deadly sins, **Gluttony** and **Wrath**, but they may join the parties for the final five, beginning with **Sloth** on Jan. 21. Working that

Goth majik on the turntables is **DJ Christ**. 18 & over are welcome; there's a bar for those 21 and over.

Weekend Goths can get evil at **Temple** at 142 Mokauea St. every Friday night. Temple is, in essence, a dark gathering place for creatures of the night, in the true sense of the underground, keeping the scene alive for fallen angels of all ages ... huge concrete dance floor ... atmospheric projections ... ethereal decorations and a couch-laden chill chamber. The flyer invites you to come and explore, to move through the shadows and experience the mystery — I give mad props to experiencing the mystery.

Moving on down towards the bottom of the pop-cultural ladder, to booty music: Xtremely boring **Radio 104.3** now presents "extremely live" **Extreme Saturdays**. This appears to be the final step of a great master plan to push the word "Extreme" into complete meaningless. The "extreme team" DJs are **Eddie L & Kutmaster Spaz** spinning hip hop and booty. Hosted by **J Rock** and "backed" by **DJ Malik**, whatever that means. Two-dollar drinks and no cover till 11 p.m. Sorry, booty-call-in' kiddies, this ones for 21 and over. For information, call 946-MIXX.

Well, that should be enough to keep us all busy for the next week or so. In the meantime, mad props to all my fallen angels — keep it ethereal.
