The Poverty Lifestyle

This week's column is a collection of small reports compiled by the "Clubbed to Death" staff of investigative journalists. Most of the reports are at least vaguely related to Honolulu's club scene. The rest have been modified slightly to fit the thematic format of the column.

Thursdays, pt 3: Discotheque Nightclub: Oh yes it's '80s night and the feel-in's right, oh yes it's '80s night, oh what a night. Discotheque is a new nightclub in the old Pink Cadillac/Rendezvous/Mixx location. Discotheque describes itself in ambiguous and nonexclusive terms as a club for "alternative lifestyles." As an alternative to taking your money, Discotheque charges no cover before midnight, which is a practice that fits well with my own lifestyle — that is, the poverty lifestyle. Headlining DJ's will be Chicago veteran Chris Gin spinning Chicago house, Quicksilver of San Diego busting the hard trance, San Francisco's junglist UFOI and Honolulu's (and Chicago's) own G-Spot. 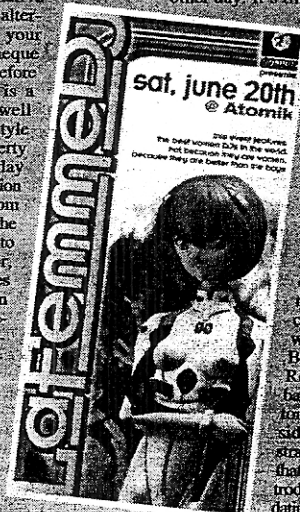

Headlining is DJ Heather of Chicago (back by popular demand) who will drop two sets, house and hip hop — take that, over-specialized male DJs! Also on the bill are two from San Francisco, junglist Sage and Bvillyn, who'll be kicking disco-house and garage. For information about both events call 956-9958.
