Jungle fever

When it comes to dance music, nothing beats a rumbling, low-end bassline that you can feel in your bones. And not many people deliver it better than drum-and-bass duo Total Science. Hailing from Oxford, England, the pair, who individually go by the names Q Project (Jason Greenhalgh) and Spinback (Paul Smith), have been delivering hard and heavy dance music under different guises since the early '90s. But it was in 1997, under the name Total Science, and with a number of hit singles including the drum-and-bass classic "Champion Sound," that the duo would find their loyal fan base across the globe.

While they might not be everyone's cup of tea, their influence on the drum-and-bass scene and the genre's evolution from hardcore to jungle to drum and bass is immeasurable. They've experimented with the softer, more musical side of the genre and have even dabbled in broken beat and deep house. But it is their signature hard, crashing and, some might say, apocalyptic, sound that sold records, and more important, sold out nightclubs.

Their visit to Indigo Friday will be their second—last time they were in Hawai'i, local junglists came out in droves. The Honolulu scene is small but fiercely loyal—so get there early and reserve your space by the subwoofer. —Wing Ho
